

College Essay Boot Camp



Objectives

- To become skillful in the process of brainstorming, writing, and refining college essays
- To finish and refine *at least* one high quality response to a college essay prompt by the early decision deadline.
- This college essay will be displayed in the school.

Deadlines and Assessment

- You must bring three copies of a draft on Friday, October 31st for peer review. This will be worth 20 points (Community Learning). You will turn one of these essays to me for comments.
- You must submit your final essay by the end of class Friday, November 7th.
- Your final essay will be assessed out of 20 points (Formative) on the attached rubric
- You will create a display board showing your essay in the halls of our school. This is worth 5 points (Formative)

Prompts

- Research the individual schools to which you want to apply, and respond to a prompt specific to your college/university. If you don't know where you will apply, use one of the Common App prompts.

Common App Prompts

- Some students have a background or story that is so central to their identity that they believe their application would be incomplete without it. If this sounds like you, then please share your story.
- Recount an incident or time when you experienced failure. How did it affect you, and what lessons did you learn?
- Reflect on a time when you challenged a belief or idea. What prompted you to act? Would you make the same decision again?
- Describe a place or environment where you are perfectly content. What do you do or experience there, and why is it meaningful to you?
- Discuss an accomplishment or event, formal or informal, that marked your transition from childhood to adulthood within your culture, community, or family.

Additional Expectations

- If you plans for next year are unclear, it is still an expectation that you write one college essay. Having one strong essay will give you a tool to apply in the future, should you desire.
- There may not be time for writing multiple essays, though many of you might want/need to. This mini-project is designed to give you the tools to write more but not necessarily the time.
