What's going on with youth in La Plata County?

Timeline

2003 – local mentoring program wanted to county to take a more positive view of youth

2006 – idea presented at Community Summit

2007 – County, Durango, Ignacio, and Bayfield put money in their budget

2008 – County hired a PT coordinator and a consultant from Hampton, VA

La Plata County Followed Others

Hampton had just received Harvard University's Innovation in American Government award for their youth master planning process

Also modeled after a similar effort in Jefferson County

Inclusive Research

Seven citizen committees

Surveys

Focus groups

Interviews

Planning workshops

Website for results and taking comments

La Plata County has 150 non-profits focused on children, youth, and families

Guiding Question

"Are we doing all that we can to ensure that all children youth and families thrive"?

Each citizen committee made a single recommendation by April 1, 2008

Approach: Problem free is not fully prepared, fully prepared is not fully developed, and fully developed is not fully engaged.

Early Childhood Subcommittee

Recommendation - Make quality childcare services and in-home supports accessible to all children.

Youth in Transition Subcommittee

Recommendation: An info system that connects everyone in the county to the resources they need to thrive.

Youth Development & Education/Afterschool Subcommittees

Joint Recommendation - Countywide youth engagement & service learning system that ensures all youth can be meaningfully involved in the decisions, structures and processes that affect them

Family Economics Subcommittee

Recommendation: Everyone residing in La Plata County has the opportunity to earn a livable wage.

Health and Safety Subcommittee

Recommendation – Positive interactions between all citizens and the health and safety networks that serve the community

Neighborhood & Communities Subcommittee

Recommendation – Create activities, places and organizations that help people find their voice.

What's Happened Since?

- Local governments haven't put money toward implementation
- New round of Development Assets data collected with a grant
- Informal working groups and volunteers continue to push for some of the recommendations
