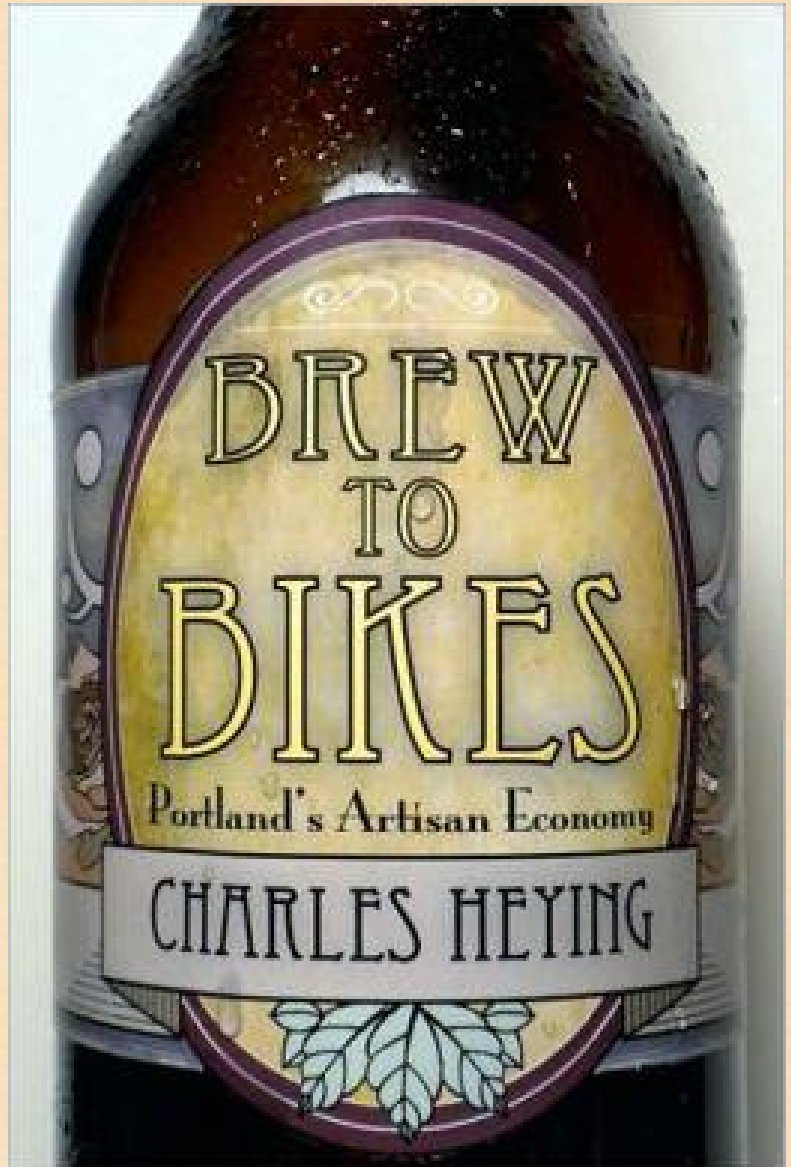


# Handmade Wealth: Lessons from Portland's Artisan Economy
